Who can use Learning Together @ Home?

The Learning Together @ Home service is for families with children who might need a little extra support. The reasons for this could include:

- social isolation
- someone in your family, including a child, who has:
 - mental health issues or learning difficulties
 - disabilities
 - developmental delay
- newly arrived in Australia
- young parents
- new pressures, like illness or multiple births
- living in poverty
- living somewhere remote (geographically isolated).

Whenever possible, priority is given to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families and children under the guardianship of the minister.

What is Learning Together @ Home

Learning Together @ Home is a service to help you support your child's learning through play.

A Learning Together @ Home fieldworker will visit you and your family in your own home. They will visit regularly at a suitable day and time.

The service is free.

What happens at Learning Together @ Home?

Each family's experience is a little different. How often and what happens will change depending on what your family needs.

The fieldworker will use play to work together with you and your child. They will:

- play, sing and talk with you and your child so you can all get to know each other
- help you to bring play into your everyday activities
- work with you to set goals – sometimes they will be small goals, but they'll build up to bigger ones.



Is any special set up needed?

You only need a space to play – a spot on the floor is usually okay. The fieldworker will bring lots of ideas and resources with them.

How long does Learning Together @ Home go for?

Your access to the service can last between 3 and 12 months. It changes depending on your family's needs and the availability of fieldworkers.

What will you get out of Learning Together @ Home?

You can:

- discover more about:
 - how your child learns
 - your child's behavior
 - ways to help your child learn
- ask all those questions you've always wanted to ask
- connect to early childhood and other specialists.

What will your child get out of Learning Together @ Home?

Children are learning from the moment they are born. Your role as parent or carer is central to helping your child learn.

With the help of the Learning Together @ Home fieldworker, your child might be:

- having fun with you
- singing, reading and playing
- developing learning skills
- becoming confident and independent.
